Reflect on how the Graduate Certificate in Nonprofit Management has been helpful in his career. Also, share information about how he is helping those he supervises with career development.
- Kristi Luzar, Program Manager, Urban Economic Development Association. Talk about her career journey, and, if she feels comfortable, next steps. Reflect on how the Graduate Certificate in Nonprofit Management has been helpful in her career. Also, offer perspectives on the benefits of networkin -- belonging to a professional organization (YNPM.)
